

Young people are so connected to the world through their devices that, by now, the vast majority of them will be aware of recent events in Israel, even if they're not quite old enough to comprehend them fully.

Many children will have watched or read potentially distressing online news items covering the violence – and will possibly need extra reassurance from trusted adults in these unsettling days. More than 102,000 children in England are starting primary school this term (aged 4-5 years old) at risk of catching measles and becoming seriously unwell. The MMR vaccine, which protects against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella, is safe and has been in use since the 1980s. The NHS provides this vaccination for free, with the initial dose given at the age of one, followed by a second dose when the child is 3 years and 4 months old. These vaccinations offer prolonged protection against measles, mumps and rubella. Exhaustive research has affirmed that there is no connection between the MMR vaccine and autism.

Call to action:

- If your child has missed their first or second dose of MMR vaccine, contact your GP practice to book an appointment.
- If you are unsure if your child is due a vaccination or has missed a vaccination, check their red book or contact your GP practice.
- For adults, it is never too late to catch up on any missed MMR vaccinations, contact your GP practice to book an appointment
