



Waymakers: Autumn 2 2025



English: Poetry. We will study a poem and explore descriptive language, and rhythm to create our vibrant poems. We'll also learn how to write an informative recount.

Maths: Area, Multiplication and Division. We will be exploring area and developing multiplication and division skills to solve related problems.

Science: Our focus will be on Sound. The topic will explore how sounds are made and travel, investigate pitch and volume, and include experiments to understand how we hear different sounds.

RE: What Makes Some Texts Sacred? We'll be learning why some writings are special and important in different religions.

Learning beyond the classroom: We look forward to a trip to the library and to Jamb owls at Hall Place. The visit to **Jamb Owls** will help children learn about owls, their habitats, and adaptations, supporting science learning and encouraging curiosity about nature.

Home learning: Reading for 20 minutes, 5 times per week is the most important homework. Some students have not completed this. Please ensure to do this with your child.

Also, complete TTRS at least 10 minutes a day to make maths easier for your child.

Author of the term: We continue with our fiction novel Twist of Gold by the author Michael Morpurgo.

History/Geography: How have children's lives changed? Comparing children's lives in the past and present.

PE: Swimming is still on Thursdays. Year 3 will have PE. Wednesdays: Forest school. Please wear PE kits on these days.

Computing: Online safety – reputation. Understanding how online behaviour affects reputation.

Art/DT: Structure: Pavilions
Design and construct pavilion structures, explore frame stability and create design ideas with a range of materials.

Music: Rock and Roll. We will be exploring the features of rock and roll music and performing pieces in this style.

PSHE: Citizenship – Learning about rights, responsibilities, and contributing positively to the community.
